

Red China

WHEREAS the Fifth World Order Study Conference of the National Council of Churches, meeting in Cleveland, Ohio, last fall urged both the recognition and admittance of Communist China to the United Nations; and

WHEREAS such pronouncement gave comfort and support to Communists around the world, weakening the United States' courageous position of firm opposition to Communism and giving cause for alarm to the free world; and

WHEREAS to recognize Red China and admit her to membership in the United Nations would be a betrayal of both morality and all those who have suffered so keenly because of Communism, especially those of our Christian brethren who have endured for the sake of their loyalty to Christ the horrors of Communists' persecution and oppression; and

WHEREAS the statement of the Fifth World Order Study Conference in no way reflects the thinking and feeling of the Christian community, but reflects only the well-known leftist tendencies of many of the officials of the National Council of Churches;

BE IT RESOLVED that the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches declare itself unequivocally and unalterably opposed to Red China's recognition by the United States and her admittance to membership in the United Nations, and that we commend the President of the United States for his realistic approach to the threat of Communism, and for his admirable conduct in refusing to sacrifice morality and principle in an hour when so many are willing to do so.
