## **Prague Christian Peace Conference**

WHEREAS the American Baptist Convention in its recent meeting in Atlantic City, New Jersey, May 18–22, 1964, announced that upon the recommendation of the American Baptist Foreign Mission Society, one of its officers would be sent as an official observer to the Prague Christian Peace Conference in Czechoslovakia; and

WHEREAS the Prague Christian Peace Conference is a Communist organization for the promotion of Communism in the field of peace and "peaceful co-existence"; and

WHEREAS Dr. Josef L. Hromadka has been and still is the president of this Peace Conference; and

WHEREAS Dr. Hromadka is on record as saying there is nothing in Communism that is inconsistent with Christianity, it should be pointed out that this action at Atlantic City is another step by the Convention to lead its churches and members along the path of co-operation and peaceful co-existence with the enemy of God and freedom;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches, in session at Winona Lake, Indiana, June 21–26, 1964, warn the thousands of born-again Baptists, who are members of the American Baptist Convention, of the danger involved in such cooperation and collaboration with Communist-created and Communist-controlled agencies.
